

On the 3rd of July, 2020,' Mee East Indian' YouTube Channel hosted their very first live interview The guest was the best none other than our very own Mr. Moses Michael Gomes, we needed to give him his due Ashwin D'souza the host asked all the right questions with meaningful insights

The cinematographer, Nathan D'souza who excelled with the video recording, editing, sounds and lights

Moses' parents Marceline and Michael welcomed him into this world on the 28th of February, 1959
He was the last sibling in a family of eight, a star in our universe who was going to glisten and shine
His primary education was in a Marathi medium (K.G. to Std.IV) Holy Cross School
Before attending secondary school Moses attended AV Class i.e. an Anglo Vernacular at Holy Cross High School
(Std. V to X, XI Science at Holy Cross High School

Moses continued his studies at Ismail Yousuf College taking a break doing a diploma in skills he got his B.Sc. degree in Physics because it was free

He also went on to do a course in Engineering from St. John's College which held him in good stead we can see Fr. Vincent Gonsalves has been credited as his mentor and guided him to a great length Mrs. Jean Moses his wife has been his avid supporter and pillar of strength

Moses started off as a 'grave digger' and a 'Table Boy' in the Parish Presbytery

He then went on to be a Peon, Lab Assistant, and Junior Clerk at the Holy Cross Parish School as a substitute on a salary of Three Hundred and Fifty Rupees a month without getting weary

He was also a hand cart pusher, a tuition tutor, sold crackers, did typing jobs for advocates and Premiere Automobile Ltd. Contractors

He supplied crockery for weddings and parties, was a musician who played for weddings and funerals and a part time mandap(venue) decorator

He also ventured into construction of old houses with Fr. Vincent Gonsalves as his guarantor He learnt to read RCC plans as part of his work he was a quick learner He assisted other parishioners to conduct free tuition classes for the under privileged parishioners He also served as a Typing Tutor in the Parish in his early years

In 1979, Moses started a Kindergarten in his family house with his wife and sister with just thirteen students Today he is the C.E.O. of Franciscan Nursery, Michael High School and Marceline Junior College which has more than Eight Thousand Five Hundred students

In 1986 Moses started the 'Catholic Education Society' to run the education institutions The school has won accolades, trophies and medals for being the best in the field of education

On the 5th of September, 2012, Mrs. Jean Gomes was awarded the National Award for the best teacher for the year 2011 by the President of India, Mr. Pranab Mukherjee

Mrs. Jean Gomes credits her spouse Moses for supporting her in completing her studies

Free education has been provided to the underprivileged Catholic community from K.G. to Std. XII (Arts, Science and Commerce) and provides scholarships for 200 students who are achievers irrespective of caste or creed which is a great relief

Education for all and All for Education is Moses' firm belief

The alphabet 'T' is his favorite because it governs our 'Thoughts' which can be good or bad, positive or negative He believes in hard work, education and utilizing our talents in order to stay physically and mentally active Savvy Mendonca, his daughter says her father is a rock solid man without fear He has taught her 'Patience' and has always been there for her

'Moses Sir' the community is indeed very proud of you May you achieve unlimited success in everything you do!



We celebrate the feast of St Ann and Joaquim on the 26^{th} of July , the grandparents of our Lord Jesus and parents of Mother Mary, we dedicate this issue to our grandparents namely the original children of the soil. Sant Anna ani Joaquim cha Sann; that is how we remember our grandparents talk about the feast , we also have an East indian hymn dedicated to the grandparents of Jesus. Today all that we are , we owe to our forefathers and grandparents. So what makes our grandparents unique and what have they instilled in us that make us what we are today , a few words that come to mind are the uniqueness in the Jewellery , lands and farming, fishing , food, home remedies, barter system and business , our language and our values.

Jewellery

I once remember telling my friend that I am an East Indian and she immediately asked me "Do you drink tea from a gold cup and saucer?", I couldn't stop laughing and blushing at the same time but that made me realise how important jewellery is and was to our grandparents, the unique designs and pieces of art that they wore were not only an accessory but even a status symbol, be it daily use or an occasion, jewels were always important, to name a few the son kari, poth, mangalsutra, bangria, vaalya, wedding set etc were essentials for each and every bride. The women adorned themselves with beautiful necklaces, bangles and earrings daily. I once didn't wear earrings and my grandmother immediately told me to wear one and said that it is not ok for a young girl to be with bare ears. This clearly shows that our love for jewellery descends from our grandparents.

Lands

We are the children of the soil and we are so called because our grandparents toiled hard and treated land with the utmost respect, many of us still own acres of ancestoral land in Bombay because our grandparents drilled it deep into our minds that the value of Land can only go up and owning Land is a blessing, our grandparents were farmers, fishermen, carpenters etc, they put their land to the best of use for their business and never sold land for a quick profit. Im sure most of you must remember how hard our grandparents worked although they had the option of making money by selling land but they never did and we need to remember the sacrifices and carry on their legacy by putting our land to good use and retaining what we own.

Food

The one thing that our grandparents enjoyed and had a great passion for is Food, I mean all the hardwork needed some reward and they found that in food right from simple sukka kardi to festive Dukracha Indial. Our grandparents surely knew their ingredients and flavours. They knew how to combine humble ingredients to make something special, they used the produce that they grew to its full potential. The utensils and equipment used for grinding masala, the chulla for roasting masala are still etched in my memory from my childhood. Today the Bottle masala is used by every household be it East Indian or not. The technique used for the handbreads, the fugias. Drinks like Kimad and our homemade wine are recipes that everyone looks for. The sweets like Killi cake, Thali sweet, Newris, Atola are all so unique and well balanced. I can go on and on about food and how rewarding each dish is and we owe all our love and passion for food to our grandparents.

Medicine

It is funny but the first medicine that I remember tasting as a child from my grandmother is KIMAD, I am serious, whenever we had a cold or cough, we had to take a spoonful of Kimad and it wasn't even virgin and it had doctors brandy in it with all the spices brewed to perfection topped with honey. It worked like a miracle. Part of our immunity being so strong are these home remedies, another one that comes to my mind is an almost raw gawti chicken egg with haldi and honey, so the egg was dipped in boiling water for about a minute and then cracked open, tipped into a small bowl with haldi and honey, I still have that till date for any kind of cough and cold. Phadki or alum mixed with haldi was out on wounds, a clove was used to cure tooth aches. Our grandparents were the only doctors we needed as children.

Business and Barter

As we all know that we are the original inhabitants of Bombay and our grandparents worked really hard to get us to where we stand today. The trade skills that they possessed along with their hardwork and dedication made them successful. When they owned land, they used it for farming. They became carpenters and carvers when they had exquisite wood and skill. They became fishermen when they lived near the sea. Along with providing for their family, they also had this barter system that worked well for them, barter of grains for fish, fresh produce for cattle etc. They laid the foundation for us so that we work hard and know the value of work.

All in all, we have inherited jewels, land and talent from our grandparents but most importantly our values and ethics come from those humble and strong souls. Going to church, praying as a family and being God fearing human beings all of it comes from out grandparents. One phrase still echos in my mind from my grandmother "Anthrun ashel tavdes paay pasrache" (Stretch your legs only as much as your bedsheet). This phrase has a deep meaning reminding us that we should spend only as much we can afford to, they never really believed in loans or credit system, everything they used was hard earned.

I hope you walk down memory lane while you read this issue and remember your childhood and your grandparents. If you still have your grandparents around don't forget to sit with them and write down their favourite recipes and hear few of their stories, eventually those are the jewels you will treasure.
