Neil Pereira – East Indian Activist of the Year.

- *Neil Pereira has been an Activist for the last 25 years following in the footsteps of his Late Father, Lawrence Pereira who was involved in Church activities and received the Papal Award
- *Neil has strongly taken up issues of illegal construction, objecting to Commercial Activities in residential areas, storm water drains and firefighting systems installation
- *He was instrumental in getting the Heritage tag for Palli Gaothan
- *He is also involved in the discussions and follow up with Govt. Authorities for Demarcation and DCR for the New DP 2034 and for Preservation of Our Gaothans and Koliwadass and is also on the Committee of Koliwada Gaothan Kruti Samiti.

Late Thomas Pereira – East Indian Music Legend of the Year

- *Thomas Pereira, one of the greatest East-Indian Singer ever, was born on 15th October, 1928
- *Thomas studied in a Marathi medium school and later shifted to Dr. Antonio Da Silva High School
- *He started his singing career at a young age of 16 with his own compositions
- *People used to be surprised to see how such a young lad could compose so excellently, specially his competitors
- *Looking at his personality, great film makers, like Late Ramanand Sagar, V Shantaram and Dada Kondke, offered him roles in films.
- *Thomas was a man of incredible talents, a writer, composer, music maker and singer par excellence. Also popularly called the King of East-Indian Singing [ASLI HEERA].
- *Popular songs - “Balotian Khoun”, “Arde Rotivar Laath”, “Aischa Kalij” and many others

- *The Cross Built On A Flat Rock In Marathi Called Patla Which Means Big Flat Rock By The Fisherman Of Bazaar Rd And Chapel Rd
- *In The Night's With The Moonlight The Cross Was Like A Light House For The Kolies To Return Home Safely
- *At that time there Was No Reclamation, No BMC Or No MHADA. This Holy Cross was built in the year 1825

*Keithair Misquitta along with Aarohi Pandit has become the first women in the world to fly a Light Sport Aircraft from Tropic to Arctic (India to Greenland)

AGERA – Maharashtra's Native Harvest Festival

Around 5 years ago Agera was a forgotten tradition in many parishes. A few parishes kept on the tradition in whatever small way they could. Mobai Gaothan Panchayat was one of the associations that took the initiative to revive this festival which was slowly fading with each passing year. Agera was a big festival when a large section of our community had fields and farming was one of the main occupations. It was a special day as our community celebrated this Harvest Festival as a Thanksgiving to God for blessing the family and the village with a good harvest. As our fields vanished due to development the festival did not have a connect with the East Indian community in the city.

The East Indian Community, sons-of-soil of Bombay, Thane, Raigad and Vasai celebrate Agera on the first Sunday in October. The Archdiocese in recent times also celebrates the Native Harvest Festival, Agera as "Thanksgiving day". The feast is celebrated across East Indian Gaothans with great enthusiasm. The local East Indian Groups based in urban areas are making efforts to revive this great harvest festival of Agera in the traditional way. In many villages in Manori-Gorai-Uttan, Vasai, Thane and Raigad the festival has always been celebrated the traditional way as many families continue to follow their occupation of farming. While the farming villages of the East Indian Community celebrate Agera as per tradition followed for generations, those in the city generally begin their celebrations from the Holy Cross in the Gaothans.

MGP started first around 5 years ago by arranging for paddy required by those in the city for the Agera festival. In the last more than 5 years Agera is slowly catching up and more parishes are reviving this tradition and some have made their Agera celebrations bigger. St.John's East Indian Community, Marol organizes a procession from the Gaothan to the Church followed by mass and a Cultural Programme. Holy Family Church, Chakala will have processions from 4 East Indian Gaothans – Gundavli, JB Nagar, Parsi wadi and Chakala meeting at the Church for a joint Eucharistic celebration. Agera celebration has got better each passing year at Holy Cross Church Kurla and is organized by USWA. The USWA members grow paddy in the church backyard about a month before Agera and celebrate the festival in the traditional way. The priest goes to the backyard where the members cut paddy in their traditional outfits followed by blessing and procession to Church.

The Indigenous People have marked Agera in their calendar, yet another big day to celebrate for the East Indian Community. This year Agera will be celebrated on Sunday, 6th October and MGP targets to have this festival celebrated at 100 Gaothans. Wishing you all a Happy Agera. May this harvest festival bless your homes with abundance of food and happiness

MGP Guidelines for Agera Celebrations

- *Start Procession from a Holy Cross in the Village or nearest paddy field(the priest cuts a few sheaves of paddy)
- *In procession the bundles of paddy to be carried by ladies in traditional Lagra or men in traditional Surkhas
- *East Indian brass band or Vanzootar(local tribal band) to be a part of the procession
- *Ideally hire a Tonga, Rekla or Bullock cart as a part of procession
- *The procession enters church where the paddy is kept near the altar for blessing
- *Offerings of fresh fruits and vegetables to be made during offertory or when the procession enters the church
- *After mass the East Indians in traditional attire to distribute the paddy
- *East Indian band to play some celebration songs after mass
- *Stalls selling East Indian food to be set up especially harvest related food stuff
- *The families go back home and affix the paddy on their entrance door or place it on the alter
- *The family prepares a traditional meal keeping the harvest festival in mind
- *Each East Indian family have the afternoon meal together with a thanksgiving prayer
- *Before the meal the family serves homemade wine or Khimad calling out "Sukhala" the East Indian way
- *In the evening the families visit their friends and relatives or join the village get-together.

MGP Opposes the plan for Bridges to Gorai-Manori

The news about a “Cable Stayed Bridge” over the troubled waters of the creek across Marve and Manori has become a burning subject with the locals and residents of Dharavi Bet, Environmentalists and Tourists who visit the island to soak in the natural beauty and serenity of the region which is earmarked as a tourism and recreation zone. The locals mainly Kolis, Kulbis, Bhandaris and Agris are extremely disappointed about the way our city planners are going back and forth on whether or not to build the bridge amidst tremendous opposition from the residents of Dharavi Bet (Manori, Gorai Uttan region).

A couple of years ago when Arvinder Sing Pal Madan was commissioner of MMRDA, a meeting was called at the conference hall of MMRDA in Bandra East. Representatives of the Island and East Indian Association Heads were invited to express their opinions. Almost everyone in the hall voiced their dissent. Mr.Madan then said he would pass this information to the Government.

Amongst those present was Mobai Gaothan Panchayat a registered trust, representative of a significantly large number of East Indians. At that meeting MGP had expressed their protest at the government's plans to bridge. MGP had even suggested that instead of wasting such a huge sum of money, the government could happily build decent jetties and ferries to transport the tourists across. Building a bridge across to Dharavi Bet would defeat the purpose of earmarking the island as a tourism zone and destroy the tranquility and serenity of the island. Tourists visit the island for the way it is at present. Building a bridge would mean, like connecting Bandra with Worli. The bridge would also lead to urbanizing the island and also destroying the natural beauty, the ancient culture of the locals and change the demography of the island forever.

There already exists a motorable road to the island and hundreds of cars and buses use this road every day to visit Esselworld and the beaches at Uttan, Gorai & Manori. Having a bridge would add to the chaos and kill the peace and quiet of the island. So where is the need for a bridge?

A couple of years ago, the government had decided to hold back their plans to build a bridge. Now why suddenly it has woken up and advertised calling for Expression of Interest to build bridges. Mobai Gaothan Panchayat is totally opposed to this “Cable Stayed Bridge” project. We will fight this project tooth and nail.

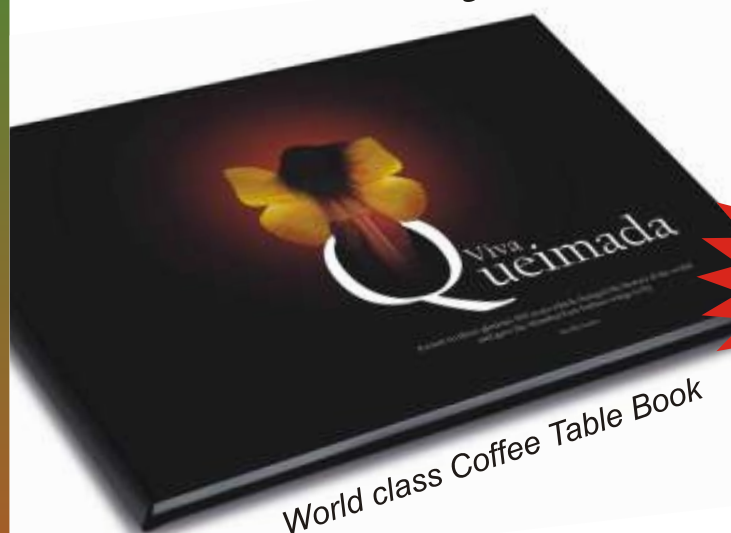
