Central and State Government

1. Simplified OBC certificate process for East Indian community
2. East Indian Representative to be appointed with Special representation in the State on behalf of the Sons-of-Soil community

This Christmas Festival promotes Unity in Diversity amongst the General Public. There will be Celebration at the National, State and City level.






