SAN JAO CHA SANN - JAAVAYCHA SANN

The East Indian Tradition on St. John the Baptist Feast

- *San Jao Cha San is celebrated by the East Indian Community on 24th June, Feast of St.John the Baptist or on the Sunday after the feast day.
- *This feast is also celebrated as Jaavaycha Sann (New Son-in-Law Day)
- *On the eve of the feast day the newly-wed couple visit the Bride's residence and are welcomed with fanfare
- *On the feast day the New wed couple visits the Bride's Parish for mass in traditional attire not forgetting the gold worn and gifted at their wedding
- *The couple are served with traditional East Indian Sweets like Letri, Laapsi, Mugoori, nevris after mass at the bride's residence
- *The Bride's parents cook a special lunch buffet with varyas, fugias, moile, fugaath, wedding pickle, wedding rice, roast, vindyal and sarpatel for the newly weds
- *The Newly Wed couple then visit the nearest well or pond for a dip and in some places they also wash the feet of the newly weds
- *The Newlyweds are taken in a procession with the East Indian Brass Band

We at MGP are compiling more data on the feast for our planned historical project - Reetin Reevaj, A Cultural and Traditional Guide for our East Indian Community.

Reviving the feast of San Jao Bautis

Special traditional feasts, just evaporate with time in this modern world and so there is a need for revival. The San Jao Sann (the feast of St.John the Baptist) is celebrated on 24th June or on a Sunday immediately after the feast day. This feast is also celebrated as Zaavaycha Sann (newly wed son-in-law day) by the East Indian Community. The San Jao feast is linked to the Baptism and the water connect hence the celebrations happen at a water body, mostly a well. The youngsters used to celebrate at the Community well or pond and jump into it as a part of the celebrations

Avareness and promotion of this festival is a part of our plam to revive our culture and tradition. On the eve of the feast day the newly wed couple is welcomed at the bride's home. On the feast day the newly wed couple visits the bride's parish dressed in traditional attire. After they return to the bride's home the son-in-law is given "Maan" (respect) to the fullest with a rich spread of a traditional East Indian Lunch. The newly wed couple then visit the local community well or pond accompanied by music by the East Indian brass band. At the pond the feet of the newly wed are washed as a part of the ritual. The newly wed couple along with their relatives then return to the bride's home as the celebrations continue. During the 1st year after marriage the newly wed couples visit the brides home for all major festivals like Christmas, Easter and the Parish feast.

New ways to celebrate San Jao feast in these modern times need to be reviewed and initiated. With the shortage of wells and water bodies, a celebration at resort with a swimming pool, by groups or families could be a great way to celebrate. Local groups or associations could organise a common brass band for all newly wed couples to be taken around the village as a part of the celebration. The costs of the bands could be borne by the local associations or contributions from the families of the newly weds. The families of the bride to invite their newly wed couple to revive this East Indian celebration. This traditional celebration is still practiced in Dharavi beth region of Manori, Culvem, Gorai, Uttan, and Bhayander

oyous celebrations of the San Jao feast has seen a dip year on year and it's time to gear up this celebration. We need to do our best and also initiate projects within the Gaothans with the water theme. Each gaothan could revive or restore a community well or pond for the traditional Umbrachapani and the San Jao Cha Sann. Cleaning of community wells which can come to the rescue during water emergencies should be encouraged. Gaothans often have water issues due to low pressure or other technical reasons and a bore well in each Gaothan can surely help. Water bodies in and around Gaothans need to be revived and restored to their original glory. Various government water-based schemes may be of great help to fulfil this revival and restoration plan.

Activities should be organised across Gaothans on this day. The local groups could take a procession around the Gaothans to celebrate the San Jao feast. There could be a evening of celebrations in the Gaothan square or a nearby venue to celebrate this festival for newly weds sponsored by the local group or the families of the newly weds. Youth can revive the gatherings at the community well or pond. If need arises an artificial well or pond could be created which can be used for community weddings and celebrations. Mobai Gaothan Panchayat has connected with its network across the gaothans to plan the revival of this celebration.

On the revival mode the community will face challenges for the celebration. This is a more challenging project than the revival of Agera. The revival of Agera was a true outcome of participation and support by local communities members and groups. MGP looks forward to the same for this festival with a target to reach a first basic step within 5 years and if there is success, we take a bigger step in 10 years. Every community activist and group will need to give their bit to revive this festival. The East Indian Community has seen a major revival on the culture and tradition scene in the last 10 years and Mobai Gaothan Panchayat MGP) has surely played an important role with the support of activists and groups. Together let's revive San Jao Cha Sann and Zaavaycha Sann giving it a true East Indian Indentity.

Memorandum of the East Indian Community

ARCHDIOCESE

- 1. Properties donated by East Indians should not be sold, if parish cannot develop or use for the betterment of the community, they must be returned back to the original owners
- 2. The Word "East Indian Catholic" to be written in remarks column without visit to archbishop's house to be done as per recommendation by local East Indian association heads or professionals
- 3. Halls and grounds provided for occasion to be given at discounted rates for East Indians
- 4. Special discounts and reservation of beds at Catholic Hospitals
- Housing schemes for East Indians on vacant church properties and existing properties going for redevelopment
- 6. Preference to East Indians for jobs opportunities in the Parish, Church organisations and institutions
- 7. Mass and Hymns in the East Indian dialect every week
- 8. Land to be allotted for the East Indian Bhavan
- 9. Special East Indian Community Member to be appointed in the Parish Council to protect and preserve East Indian traditions and heritage
- 10. East Indians to be appointed on the finance and property committees
- 11. Stalls to be allotted at the Bandra Fair to the East Indian Community
- 12. St. Gonsalo Garcia Day to be made official and a Church in Bombay to be dedicated to the Saint




