

HOUSING

- *Housing Quota on MHADA projects for East Indians
- *A special Bhumiputra Housing Scheme to be initiated
- *Gaothan expansion policy to be implemented by allotting lands towards East Indian community housing projects in lieu of land unavailable around gaothans

INFRA COMPENSATION

The community lands were taken away under various laws like Land Acquisition Act, Land to tiller Act, Urban Land Ceiling Act and the original owners were never compensated. These lands which were taken for infra projects are now today converted to commercial projects hence a compensation for these need to be given especially for the below mentioned projects which are on lands with East Indians as original owners

- *Sahar International Airport and Santacruz Domestic Airport
- *Bandra Kurla Complex
- *Kalina University
- *Aarey
- *Railways
- *Juhu Aerodrome

TAX

The East Indians as Indigenous People should not be taxed

- *No Municipal Property and Water Tax for all houses in the Gaothans owned before 1960
- *Electricity with a special scheme basis consumption where those upto a specific consumption get it for free

CULTURE PROMOTION

- *East Indian Bhavan in Bombay-Thane-Vasai and Raigad
- *Special permissions for time limit to be given for Umbrachapani and Christmas midnight mass
- *Space to be allotted for Community Centre at each East Indian Gaothan

Self government

CASTE CERTIFICATE

- *Simplified OBC certificate process for East Indian Community
- *East Indian Community to be granted Schedule Tribe Status

JOBS

- *Special job reservations for East Indian community in public and private corporates
- *Local tourism projects to be alloted only to Indigenous People
- *Infra projects on East Indian owned lands like Airport and Railways to have a quota for jobs to Bhumiputras

BUSINESS

- *East Indian Food stalls to be approved for each Municipal ward
- *All mega infra projects like Airports and Railways should allot special stalls to promote East Indian food specialty and handicrafts
- *Each Metro station should have stalls earmarked for promotion East Indian food and handicrafts

REPRESENTATION

- *East Indian Representative to be appointed with Special representation in Maharashtra State on behalf of the Sons-of-Soil community
- *East Indian Municipal Corporator to be nominated to represent the city basis elections amongst the East Indian Community
- *Local community association heads to be authorised to suggest Gaothan civic projects

RELIGIOUS TRADITIONS

- *Regular special trains to be started from Bombay to Velankanni twice a week
- *Special Tour subsidies for Travel to Holy Places and Pilgrimage Shrines
- *Regularisation of all Holy Crosses in the East Indian gaothans and their vicinity

TOURISM

- *Manori-Gorai-Uttan Tourism Plan and Bridge Project to be scrapped and locals to be allowed to set up their local tourism businesses
- *All tourism related projects should have an East Indian connect in the form of cultural centre, food stalls, handicraft shops and community theme centres

LANGUAGE AND DIALECT

*The East Indian Dialect to be recognised by the Central and State Government

COMMUNITY WELFARE

*An East Indian Community welfare fund to be instituted through funds allocated from land income on East Indian owned acquired lands like airport, BKC, University, industrial and infrastructure projects

MGP TEAM MEETS THE BISHOP Discussion on East Indian Agenda to the Archdiocese

MGP Team met Bishop Allwyn Dsilva to discuss the East Indian Community demands as per online Survey 2022 on Saturday, 26th November 2022. The East Indian Agenda 2023 was released at the East Indian Conclave 2022

MGP Team was represented by Alphi Dsouza, Walter Murzello and Gleason Barretto

At the 2 hour meet all the 19 demands were discussed with justifications and Bishop Allwyn assured to speak to the Cardinal on fulfilling the demands as we are the Indigenous People and have a basic right which was also emphasized by Pope Francis during his visit to Canada.

East Indian Community Demands to the Archdiocese

- 1. Properties donated by East Indians should not be sold, if parish cannot develop or use for the betterment of the community they must be returned back to the original owners
- 2. Preference to East Indians for jobs opportunities in the Parish, Church organisations and institutions
- 3. Special discounts and reservation of beds at Catholic Hospitals
- 4. Halls and grounds provided for occasion to be given at discounted rates for East Indians
- 5. Housing schemes for East Indians on vacant church properties and existing properties going for redevelopment
- 6. The Word "East Indian Catholic" to be written in remarks column without visit to archbishops house to be done as per recommendation by local East Indian association heads or professionals
- 7. Land to be allotted for the East Indian Bhavan
- 8. Special East Indian Community Member to be appointed in the Parish Council to protect and preserve East Indian traditions and heritage
- 9. Mass and Hymns in the East Indian dialect every week
- 10. East Indians to be appointed on the finance and property committees
- 11. Stalls to be alloted at the Bandra Fair to the East Indian Community
- 12. St.Gonsalo Garcia Day to be made official and a Church in Bombay to be dedicated to the Saint
- 13. Church announcements should be made about activities organized by East Indian Groups
- 14. Development projects/Monopoly for hired halls/quadrangles and grounds only to East Indian businesses
- 15. East Indian Associations to be given premises without hire charges for activities & meetings
- 16. Monthly open meets with the East Indian community and Bishops
- 17. Space to be provided for East Indian businesses on parish property
- 18. Ten percent of proceeds on hired premises to be allocated towards the East Indian Community welfare fund
- 19. Halls Grounds and Awards to be dedicated to Cardinal Simon Pimenta in each parish with East Indian majority

Bishop Allwyn spoke of journeying together by all denominations within the catholic church as emphasized at the recently held synod. He said that he would discuss the above points with the Cardinal.

Number Five post card showcases the East Indian architecture of the Gaothans (Villages) with colorful painted houses and narrow lanes with its beauty and simplicity

Post Card number six is 'The Ghumat', the traditional East Indian musical instrument played at all cultural and recreational East Indian festivities

The East Indian Bottle Masala number seven consists of a blend of spices and is the essence of East Indian cuisine each family has their own secret recipe

Number Eight is 'Marzipan' the main sweet dish for Christmas and Easter of the East Indian Community

'Umbra Cha Pani' number nine is a unique tradition and ritual, water from the roots of the Indian Fig Tree is collected by a procession of family and friends from the gaothan well for the bride to bathe the next morning

Number Ten is the most commonly used glass and clay utensils of the East Indians for storing and cooking

The evening ended with guests dancing to the beat of East Indian Marathi music with gusto and glee Snack boxes were distributed I was happy to have met up with members of the Community

Ms. Swati Pandey graciously autographed the limited edition of the set of postcards for my daughter Charlotte who is proud of her legacy

Successive Central and State Government across parties have not done much to fulfill the basic Indigenous rights of the East Indian Community. Across the world and in some states in India, the Indigenous People have been granted rights which is surely a great sign of recognition and appreciation of those who helped build the region. It's high time we as a community connect with political leaders and authorities to put forth our demands and rights as Indigenous People of this great city.

Over the years, MGP has been organising the Annual Conclave to brainstorm and finalise the best way forward for the Community. We review these Conclave action plans year on year, and last year we released a 5 year plan to create awareness about the Community under the theme, "East Indians RISE" (Revive! Initiate! Serve! Empower!). In the 2nd year 2022, our theme was, "RISE Out of the Box - Differ! Divert! Deviate!" and here our focus was on finding newer ways to achieve our objectives of creating awareness and fulfilling our demands raised to authorities. At the Conclave a point which came out strongly is to draft a Policy for East Indians as the Indigenous People which should be accepted by the Government.

Phumiputra Policy is the need of the hour and we at MGP have prepared the first draft. The Mumbai Bhumiputra Policy will be presented to political leaders across parties and various government authorities. Based on the points mentioned in the draft of the Mumbai Bhumiputra Policy, a detailed document with justifications will be prepared and followed up with the leaders and authorities who show interest and are keen to sanction this policy. Those who fulfil even one point will be appreciated and publicised across all social media platforms. Also, any positive developments will be updated to the Community at large so that they are aware about those who really care for the East Indian Community and need to be supported at various platforms.

Appreciating those who hold East Indian Community as important will be MGPs agenda. All these leaders or authorities will be felicitated and awarded post the fulfilment of demands or the Mumbai Bhumiputra Policy (MBP). The MBP will be reviewed year on year and released along with the Annual Agenda basis online survey. Experts and professionals within the community will be consulted to sharpen the MBP to make it inclusive and effective. This years Conclave has taken one big step in a positive direction, and we hope to see some points in the draft policy to be sanctioned or fulfilled. Alternatively, as per our Conclave theme, we at MGP will also look at alternatives to fulfil our demands raised to the Central Government, State Government, Municipality and the Archdiocese.

ndigenous People of MMR region, the East Indian Community needs to RISE up and do what's best to take our community forward. Like minded associations and activists should focus on the issues and work towards resolving them. While on the Culture and Tradition front, the East Indian Community seems to be improving vibrantly year on year. Likewise, we need to see the same in fulfilling our community demands. 
