





ST.GONSALO GARCIA DAY

East Indian Community celebrates feast of Maharashtra's Native Saint

obai Gaothan Panchayat(MGP) has appeals to all in the East Indian Community and all catholics who have migrated to Maharashtra to celebrate St. Gonsalo Garcia Day on 6th February every year. In the year 2013, MGP announced St. Gonsalo Garcia as the Patron Saint of the East Indian Community, as the saint is the only native saint and also of East Indian community origin. St. Gonsalo Garcia is the first Indian Saint, who lived in Vasai and born to parents of Portuguese Christians origin(the community later came to be known as East Indian Community during British rule). MGP plans to create awareness amongst the community to ensure the saint has a special place in each East Indian Village and Home.

As communicated last year, MGP installed a statue if St. Gonsalo Garcia at the East Indian Museum at Manori in May 2014.

The plans for the St. Gonsalo Garcia Day this year is as follows:-

- 1) February 6th to be observed as Saint Gonsalo Garcia Day amongst all from the East Indian Community. A similar appeal to be made to celebrate this day amongst all catholics all over India.
- 2)St. Gonsalo Garcia is now considered as a Patron Saint of the East Indian Community. A similar appeal will be sent to the Archdiocese to consider St. Gonsalo Garcia as the principal patron of the Archiodese of Bombay.
- 3)MGP is still following up on the request to the Archdiocese of Bombay to dedicate a Church or Chapel to Saint Gonsalo Garcia. MGP also plans to build a Chapel dedicated to St. Gonsalo Garcia in the Bombay diocese.
- 4)MGP will appeal to all community groups to install a statue of St.Gonsalo Garcia at Holy Crosses within the East Indian
- 5)MGP will appeal to parishes across Bombay to install a statue of St. Gonsalo Garcia in their parish premises
- 6)In catholic religious articles stores across Bombay the statuse or picture frame of St. Gonsalo Garcia is not availaable. MGP plans to have a miniature status of the Saint which the community can venerate at their Holy Altar at home.
- 7)MGP has appealed to all East Indian local associations/groups to organise a prayer/novena to St. Gonsalo Garcia at our village Holy Crosses
- 8)An appeal to the Maharashtra Government to be sent to dedicate a project and various other initiatives to honour the only Catholic Saint of Maharashtra State.

St. Gonsalo Garcia was honoured as India's only saint for almost 140 years. St. Gonsalo Garcia was born on February 6, 1557 at Vasai(called Bacaim during Portuguese rule). He died a Martyr along with 25 other companions by being crucified in Nagasaki on February 5, 1597.

Across the East Indian Community and Catholic Parishes in Bombay, Vasai, Thane and Raigad the feast of St. Gonsalo Garcia is celebrated on February 6.

EAST INDIAN RALLY 2015

Annual Rally of the East Indian Community of Bombay, Thane, Vasai and Raigad

obai Gaothan Panchayat(MGP) has organized this annual rally for the third time. The response has been good and we pray that more community members may join and realize the importance of coming together to voice our rights as aboriginals. At the East Indian Rally, the East Indian Community comes together to voice the concerns of the community against the Central/State government, Municipal Corporation and the Archdiocese. Our peace-loving community has been taken for granted by the authorities and we encourage like-minded individuals and associations to fight for the rights of the community.

If our community fails to speak up right now we may very well die a slow death. We the sons-of-soil community are being treated like strangers on our native land. Of late the East Indian Gaothans are being targeted by authorities and its time we tell them that we have the right to suggest what we need and they cannot force us to follow their regulations. The first East Indian Rally was attended by around 1000 community members and the 2nd Rally was attended by around 600 community members. Around 25 East Indian Associations are likely to support the East Indian Rally 2015.

The 3rd East Indian Rally will be held on Sunday, 1st March 2015 at 10:30am sharp. The Rally starts from Mount Carmels Church, Bandra and will end at St. Stanislaus Grounds, Bandra.

The Top 10 issues to be focused at the the rally are:-

- 1)To demand our rights as original inhabitants of Bombay and if the concerned authorities cannot fulfill our demands they should give our lands back.
- 2) Housing and Job reservations for the East Indian Community and implement of Gaothan expansion policy
- 3)Single window permissions and self developed ground-plus-two SITU for gaothans to be granted.
- 4) Land to be allotted for East Indian Bhavan and Museum in Bombay, Thane, Vasai and Raigad.
- 5) East Indian Food stalls to be allotted in each gaothan area and municipal ward.
- 6) If No tax to Encroachers then no tax should also apply to East Indians, the original owners of Bombay.
- 7)Lands donated to churches and the archdiocese should not be sold and if not developed should be returned back for community development.
- 8)Simplified OBC process and East Indian Community to the recognized as natives of Bombay by the State and Central Government.
- 9)An East Indian Community welfare fund to be started in lieu of properties given to government for airport and other infra projects
- 10)East indian gaothans to be self governed and a municipal corporator to be elected by the East Indian community, an East Indian to be appointed on the BMC/ MMRDA/ Town Planning committee for Gaothans

It is surprising to see other migrant communities being granted their demands and the East Indian Community, the original inhabitants of Bombay have not been granted a single benefit. It's time we all come together as One Voice, One East Indian Community and demand what is rightfully ours.

East Indian Community Demands

Central and State Government

- 1.Simplified OBC certificate process for East Indian community
- 2. Simplified repair permissions for Gaothans
- 3. Manori Gorai Uttan Tourism Plan to be scrapped
- 4. East Indian Representative to be appointed with Special representation in the State on behalf of the Sons-of-Soil community
- 5. East Indian Bhavan in Bombay, Thane, Vasai and Raigad
- 6. Housing Quota on MHADA projects for East Indians
- 7.An East Indian Community welfare fund to be instituted through funds allocated from land income on East Indian owned acquired lands like airport, industrial and infrastructure projects.
- 8. Special permissions for time limit to be given for Umbrachapani and Christmas midnight mass
- 9. Specific DC Rules for planned development in Gaothans
- 10. Ground plus SITU development to be permitted in Gaothans

Municipal Corporation

- 8.Local community association heads to be authorised to suggest Gaothan civic projects

- 10.Roads, bylanes and street furniture within the gaothans to be designed to maintain the village look.

- 3. Properties donated by East Indians should not be sold, if parish cannot develop or use for the betterment of the community they must be returned back to the original owners.

- 5.Land to be allotted for the East Indian Bhavan
- 6. Mass and Hymns in the East Indian dialect should be introduced
- 7.East Indians to be appointed on the finance and property committees

- 9.St.Gonsalo Garcia Day to be made official and a Church in Bombay to be dedicated to the Saint

Migrants call it their native but its not the case

EAST INDIAN FREEDOM FIGHTER'S 151ST BIRTH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATIONS

Mobai Gaothan Panchayat(MGP) in its efforts to create awareness of Bombay Natives, the East Indian Community declared that March 17th every year will be observed as Kaka Baptista Day. Joseph "Kaka" Baptista is a freedom fighter who was a close associate of Lokmanya Tilak during India's freedom struggle. Kaka Baptista was born on March 17, 1864 at Matharpacady, Mazagaon. His father, John Baptista hailed from Uttan, near Bassein.

The East Community now gears up to celebrate the 151st Birth Anniversary this year and the community has now taken upon itself to revive its culture, tradition and raise their voices against the injustice towards the community.

Some of the highlights about Kaka Baptista are as follows:-

- *Kaka Baptista coined the phrase'''Swaraj is my Birth Right'' which was later made popular by Tilak
- *Kaka Baptista was the First Mayor of Bombay in the year 1925-1926
- *He worked with BMC for 17 years from the year 1901
- *The Mazagaon Gardens is named after him and was recently renovated
- *He assisted Tilak by launching the Sarvajanik Ganpati(public Ganpati celebrations)
- *He was a legal advisor to Lokmanya Tilak.
- *Played an active role in the Home Rule Movement along with Lokmanya Tilak and Annie Besant.
- *As an Advocate in the High Court, he defended Veer Sarvarkar and demanded an open trial on the basis of fundamental rights.

Due to his valuable contribution to the city and India's freedom struggle, MGP has demanded the following to commemorate his 151st Birth Anniversary.

- *The Bandra-Worli Sealink to be named after Kaka Baptista
- *Bandra Terminus to be named after Kaka Baptista
- *A special Community fund to be started for the natives, Kaka Baptista East Indian Community Fund to support the community for Education, Medical and other needs.
- *Land to be allotted for East Indian Bhavan to have an auditorium/hall in memory of Kaka Baptista.
- *Kaka Baptista to be recognised by the Maharashtra Government for his valuable contribution to the city and country and various projects to be named after him.
- *March 17th to be recognised as Kaka Baptista Day by the Maharashtra State Government and also a special commemoration by the BMC.
- *An East Indian to be directly chosen as a Corporator by the community members and associations to represent in the BMC House

In the meanwhile, MGP plans to place a bust of Kaka Baptista at their East Indian Museum at Manori. MGP has also requested various East Indian Associations to place a bust in their offices as a sign of appreciation to their Community leader.




