

MGP OPPOSES MGU PLAN

obai Gaothan Panchayat stood solidly behind the Dharavi Beth Bachao Samiti and the three Koli Sansthas as well as the Shetkari sangathnas of Manori Gorai Utan Region. The activists insisted that local residents of MGU region must be inducted into the MMRDA team and allow them to have a say in the planning and implementation process. MGP representatives Alphi Dsouza and Walter Murzello questioned Mr.UPS Madon about the motive behind MMRDA's plans to construct the road bridges across the creek. They questioned the commissioner whether the MMRDA was genuinely interested in the Tourism plan on the MGU area or whether there was another sinister plan.

MGP very categorically impressed upon the MMRDA chief that tourists to the Manori Gorai Utan region visit the place to enjoy and experience the charm of the region just as the way as it is. Tourists are happy to travel by ferry service for pleasure derived and the experience. Also Tongas and reklas add to the charm. Tourist desire that the tranquil charm of MGU should be retained. Instead of adding to the chaos of road bridges, instead the MMRDA can concentrate on providing amenities like clinics and hospitals and schools and playgrounds, communication networks uninterrunted water and electric

supply and beautify and maintain cleanliness on the Island. They suggested that MMRDA should cooperate with the Mumbai Maritime Board to rebuild modern jetties and undertake, regular desilting and dredging operations would enhance and improve Ferry Services from Borivili to Gorai and Marve to Manori.

Mr.Madon patiently heard our suggestions but reiterated the request for bridges was based on the feelings and sentiments of the elected representatives who were requesting MMRDA to improve the amenities on the island. On a positive note, it was a good gesture on the part of the Commissioner, who called us and gave us a patient hearing. He was very receptive and allowed almost all present to speak their minds out. On the negative side of this meet, Mr. Madon seemed helpless and said the most he could do would be to put these suggestions to the government for consideration and decision.



GAOTHAN PAATIL

Mobai Gaothan Panchayat will launch its new initiative with the induction of the Gaothan Paatil with the inauguration of the East Indian Shakha at Worli Village/Gaothan. The first ever Gaothan Paatil of Modern Bombay will be Sachin Kinny, an East Indian and an original inhabitant of Bombay. MGP has also been instrumental in appointing MGP Sarpanches who are elected by ballot vote by local villagers. The main objective of the Gaothan Paatil (in earlier times spelt as Patil) will be to "Protect the Gaothans"

A brief on the Gaothan Paatil is as follows:

- 1)Gaothan Paatil will be the Village Head of a specific Gaothan or Village
- 2) A monthly Gaothan Sabha (Meeting) will be held to discuss Village issues
- 3) The Paatil will inspect the Gaothan once a month
- 4)Local civic, social and community issues will be undertaken
- 5) Paatil will recommend various projects for the Gaothan to Government authorities
- 6)Paatil will have a Gaothan Shakha Committee to advise on matters concerning the Village
- 7)Only original inhabitants can be appointed as the Gaothan Paatil
- 8) The Gaothan Paatil will be appointed by Gaothan Monitoring Committee managed by MGP
- 9) With this each Gaothan will either have a Paatil, MGP Sarpanch or a Village Head/Chief
- 10) This initiative will be applicable in all East Indian enclaves of Bombay, Dharavi Beth, Vasai, Raigad and Thane.

A brief on Patil or Police Patils who managed Bombay Villages centuries ago

Patil meaning Head or Chief is an Indian title. Territory granted to the Patil is usually referred to as the patilki or watandar. The Patil is in effect the ruler of this territory as he was entitled to the revenues collected therefrom. Many Patils were warriors in the Maratha army.

"Patil" is predominantly used by the Deccan, Vidarbha and Maratha people of Maharashtra. The native language of most Patils is predominantly Marathi. Traditionally, Patils had assistants such as the talati or kulkarni to assist them with the clerical work involved in the collection of revenue in their areas of control. 'Patil' meant 'group' or "branch" during the regime of Mahmud Begada. 'Patt'barhate meant "part of the land" and 'Patidar' meant "Tax Collector". 'Patil' meant "chief of the village".

The word Patil could also have derived from 'Patilki'. 'Patu' means "clever", and "patta" means "chief". The person who established the village used to become Patil. Patil used to become known, because of village recognition. Patil was not a government post or self occupied post. Virtues and works of the person used to make him a Patil. Later on this post became hereditary. Patil became the Village King and later received Government honor, even after receiving many posts. In some places Patils are known as 'Mokaddam' or 'Mukadam' meaning is Chief Man (King of Village).

A man who bought his relatives and opened land became the Patil or the village chief. He in essence, owned the village land and granted it to others. A Patil generally owned about 30-40 percent of land in the village. His job was to collect revenue from the entire village and submit it to the royal treasury. He not only acted as a revenue officer but as a judicial head in the village, as the chieftain of the village. Besides this the Patil was responsible for the defence of the village, tracing every crime in the village and provide protection to the village. The Patil was also awarded with rent free lands or "Inam" (Reward). A Patil also received Patilkis (village chief rights).

Among prominent Patils were the Royal Bhonsle (or Bhosle) family. Shivaji Maharaj's grandfather Maloji Bhosle was a Patil of villages near Daund in Pune and verul (ellora) near Aurangabad. The term "Police Patil" was used by the East India Company. Generally, Patils are considered as respectful people in society because of inborn leadership qualities, healthy social relationships and economic prosperity. Many Patils have achieved top positions in social, political and cultural fields in society.





KAKA BAPTISTA DAY

EAST INDIAN FREEDOM FIGHTER'S 152ND BIRTH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATIONS

Mobai Gaothan Panchayat(MGP) in its efforts to create awareness of Bombay Natives, the East Indian Community declared that March 17th every year will be observed as Kaka Baptista Day. Joseph "Kaka" Baptista is a freedom fighter who was a close associate of Lokmanya Tilak during India's freedom struggle. Kaka Baptista was born on March 17, 1864 at Matharpacady, Mazagaon. His father, John Baptista hailed from Uttan, near Bassein.

The East Community now gears up to celebrate the 152nd Birth Anniversary this year and the community has now taken upon itself to revive its culture, tradition and raise their voices against the injustice towards the community.

Some of the highlights about Kaka Baptista are as follows:-


- *Kaka Baptista coined the phrase'''Swaraj is my Birth Right'' which was later made popular by Tilak
- *Kaka Baptista was the First Mayor of Bombay in the year 1925-1926
- *He worked with BMC for 17 years from the year 1901
- *The Mazagaon Gardens is named after him and was recently renovated
- *He assisted Tilak by launching the Sarvajanik Ganpati(public Ganpati celebrations)
- *He was a legal advisor to Lokmanya Tilak.
- *Played an active role in the Home Rule Movement along with Lokmanya Tilak and Annie Besant.
- *As an Advocate in the High Court, he defended Veer Sarvarkar and demanded an open trial on the basis of fundamental rights.

Due to his valuable contribution to the city and India's freedom struggle, MGP has demanded the following to commemorate his 152nd Birth Anniversary.

- *The Bandra-Worli Sealink to be named after Kaka Baptista
- *Bandra Terminus to be named after Kaka Baptista
- *A special Community fund to be started for the natives, Kaka Baptista East Indian Community Fund to support the community for Education, Medical and other needs
- *Land to be allotted for East Indian Bhavan to have an auditorium/hall in memory of Kaka Baptista.
- *Kaka Baptista to be recognised by the Maharashtra Government for his valuable contribution to the city and country and various projects to be named after him.
- *March 17th to be recognised as Kaka Baptista Day by the Maharashtra State Government and also a special commemoration by the BMC.
- *An East Indian to be directly chosen as a Corporator by the community members and associations to represent in the BMC House

In the meanwhile, MGP plans to place a bust of Kaka Baptista at their East Indian Museum at Manori. MGP has also requested various East Indian Associations to place a bust in their offices as a sign of appreciation to their Community leader.
