



Let's Protect the Community Holy Crosses Erected before BMC's Existence

In global Christian traditions, the erection of a Holy Cross served as a shield to ward off evil, natural calamities and plague. They were also memorials of the rich and influential. They marked territory of large estates. The simple peasant folk who couldn't access the church during the evenings, found these places convenient to gather and pray. The Holy Crosses became symbols for the community. Today we find ourselves uniting in prayer at various village Crosses. These Holy Crosses have become part of our local traditions. 'An East-Indian Gaothan isn't a Gaothan without the Holy Cross'.

The need of the hour today is the protection and restoration of these symbols. But how far must one go? How much interference must we accept from the local governing bodies and how much co-operation should we extend? The tradition of Community Holy Crosses was initiated even before BMC existed. The authorities need to respect the religious sentiments and ancestral traditions of the sons-of-soil i.e. The East Indian Community. Various initiatives are being set-up by likeminded associations to protect and restore our Holy Crosses. To help us Protect the Holy Crosses, MGP proposes the concept of CROSS (Co-ordination, Restoration, Organization, Support and Security)

Coordinators - Each Gaothan or Parish should have a Cross Coordinator who will visit each cross regularly in his designated area and an update should be given to the chief Cross Coordinator. He or she can also initiate the registration process of the crosses. (Ensure that the crosses erected from early times is documented in the land register.) They should attend quarterly meets of Cross Coordinators and immediately inform all Coordinators and locals in case of emergency. Keep a chronicle with pictures of ongoing religious activities at the site.

Restoration - Ensure the Holy Crosses are well maintained. We must refrain from mindless renovation of the Cross structure but instead Restore it. Desist from encroachment on public property. A restoration panel could be set up to study the history of Holy Crosses to be restored. A proper record of documents and instances can be maintained for each cross by the Coordinators.


Organization - Ideally the local parish with active support from the Archdiocese should look after Crosses. The Archdiocese should appoint a special team to set up an Organization for the same. Committed and dedicated individuals should be assigned this responsibility. Regular diocesan cross feasts in the presence of an Ecclesiastical authority will not only improve the spiritual significance, but also enhance the connect between the shepherd of the diocese and the flock.

Support - It's the duty of each Christian to support this initiative to protect and preserve our Holy Crosses. Taking part in the evening rosary is a kind of support. But more active support in terms of finance and maintenance of the area is also expected. The locals should be the first to report at the site in case of emergency.

Security - A proper security plan should be established. The local police station should patrol at regular intervals. CCTVs can be set up at the Holy Cross. Since most of the crosses are at prominent locations, the surrounding area too is secured.


