KAKA BAPTISTA JAYANTI



Sunday 17th March 2024, Mobai Gaothan Panchayat along with various representatives and others from Utan Village gathered around Joseph Kaka Baptista's Chowk to pay our respects to our Community Hero on his 160th Birth Anniversary, Prominent among the large gathering were people from various occupation based East Indian Communities.

The morning began with our MGP awardee, and local East Indian Activist Leo Colasco "Sir" speaking about our beloved Community hero, the late Barrister Joseph Kaka Baptista. BA, LLB, LCE.

"Kaka" as he is fondly referred to was a advocate, associate and confidant of Shri Lokmanya Tilak. He was one of the prime activist of the Home Rule movement in India which was founded by Dr. Annie Besant and Bal Gangadhar Tilak.

Leo Colasco Sir reiterated the role played by Barrister Joseph Kaka Baptista during the Independence Struggle where Barrister "Kaka" acted as advocate for Bal Gangadhar Tilak.

He is credited with coining the phrase "Freedom is my birthright and I shall have it". Joseph "Kaka" Baptista, a son of Uttan was Mayor of Bombay during 1925-1926.

Finally, Leo Colasco "Sir" exhorted our East Indian and Local Communities to make representations to various governmental agencies and the legal fraternity including Supreme Court of India to consider renaming of Judicial Academy at Uttan as "Barrister Kaka Joseph Baptista Judicial Academy"

The former president late Parnab Mukherjee had during a visit to the RSS HQ in Nagpur, in a speech has referred to Baptista as one of the Founders of the Home Rule Movement in 1916.

Mumbai group preserves East Indian dialect

Group documenting unique words and phrases in dialect; the book will have glossary of East Indian words

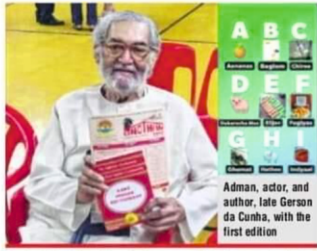

Long before Mumbai became a metropolis, the region where the city expanded had fishing and farming villages, many of which spoke a dialect of Marathi influenced by Portuguese, Konkani, and English. The dialect, called East Indian or Vashi Marathi, is now declining if not in danger of extinction altogether.

A group from Mumbai is documenting unique words and phrases in the dialect as the number of speakers, mostly senior members of the community, declines. The group, mostly composed of amateur researchers, hopes to publish the second and revised edition of the East Indian Dictionary by the end of this year. The dictionary is part of the project by the

Mobai Gaothan Panchayat, a group representing the original inhabitants of the Mumbai region, to preserve and document their culture and language. The group also plans to petition the government to nominate a representative in the government.

Amayalisa Gonsalves, a journalist and a student of media, is editing the dictionary. Much of the research is based on interviews with senior people who are often the only East Indians fluent in the dialect. The Portuguese influence in the dialect is explained by the fact that the community originally Koli, Agri, Bhandari, and other castes, were converted to Roman Catholicism by Portuguese missionaries in the 16th and 17th centuries. Vashi, now the community's main hub, was part of a Portuguese colony before it fell

The dialect has many words that have roots in Portuguese. For instance, the community uses 'Ramacha Pass' to describe the Palm Sunday processions before Good Friday. "I have heard the words as *apapadepressjournal*

dered if it had any connection to Hindu God Rama. As I researched I found that the Portuguese word for branches is Ramo. And the Portuguese word for steps is pass." said Gonsalves, referring to the biblical episode where Christ is welcomed with waving branches of the palm tree by residents of Jerusalem.

Another word that is peculiar to the dialect is 'sukhal' used by old speakers when they raised a toast. Gonsalves said it is the East Indian word for 'cheers' or 'to health/prosperity'. In this case, the word is similar to the word for happiness in Marathi, Hindi, or Sanskrit. Like many other languages and dialects spoken by relatively small populations, East Indian Marathi, which is spoken in the

Thane, and Raigad districts, and Mumbai, is declining in use. Community members said that the younger generation is not very familiar with the dialect, preferring to use English, Hindi, or standardised Marathi to converse.

Royton D'Silva, an events manager who writes and sings songs in the dialect, is an exception. D'Silva learned it because his parents conversed with him in the language. "I was more responsive when they spoke to me in the dialect. Otherwise, they used English to talk to each other," said D'Silva. Also, the use of standard Marathi words has nearly obliterated their East Indian counterparts. For instance, while younger generations call a chair 'kursi', older East Indians use the word 'kadar', derived from the Portuguese 'cadeira'.

Easter Vigil service to celebrate Risen Christ

Mumbai: The Resurrection of Jesus Christ three days after he was crucified on Good Friday is the bedrock of the Christian faith. Celebrated as Easter Sunday, this most important feast of the liturgical calendar falls March 31 this year.

The festival draws the curtain on 40 days of Lenten fasting and penance. Families celebrate the annual homecoming or reunion with meat, wine and other temptations they had forgone during Lent.

The message of hope and spring inherent in Easter grants it universal appeal across communities. Bakeries and confectioneries have laid out trays of marzipan and chocolate Easter eggs and bunnies, and hot cross buns, most of which are purchased by non-Christians.

The archbishop of Bombay Oswald Cardinal Gracias will celebrate Easter Vigil mass at Holy Name School quadrangle, Colaba, at 8.00 pm Saturday March 30.

Fr Nigel Barrett, spokesman for the archdiocese of Bombay, said, "Easter Sunday is the day of our Lord's resurrection. Our faith professes that Jesus who was crucified on Good Friday, rose from the dead three days later on Easter Sunday, symbolising victory over sin and death. The resurrection is the cornerstone of the Christian faith for it signifies the fulfilment of God's plan for redemption and offers believers the promise of eternal life. It is a day of gre-

at joy and hope."

St Andrew's Church, Bandra, will conduct Easter Vigil service on the school grounds at 8.00 pm on Holy Saturday, which is a day of silence, said assistant priest Fr Clifford D'Souza.

Sacred Heart Church in Santacruz will celebrate mass at 10.00 pm. Parish priest Fr Felix D'Souza said, "The service begins with lighting of the fire and the candles. People carry a candle with them which is lit in the beginning and for the second time to renew their faith in God. Holy water is sprinkled on the congregation. At the end of the service, people exchange Easter greetings."

Gleason Barretto of the Mobai Gaothan Panchayat explained the Easter tradition of the indigenous East Indian community. "The festival is called Pasku Cha Sann. 'Pasku' comes from the Portuguese word Pascoa (Easter) and Sann is (feast) in the East Indian dialect. In days gone by, the community waited for the priest to bless their home during Easter week but now this has changed and the house is blessed by a family member. The family prepares ethnic delicacies like duck moile, fugyas, varas, mutton khuddi, pork sarpattel, stuffed chicken, moogoori (sweet) and the all-time specialty, khimad. The family celebration starts when all raise their drinks together saying 'Sukhal-la'."

Barretto says the East Indian community keeps its Lenten traditions alive through Papiya singing, Kursacha Vaat, Ramacha Pass, Krist Puraan and Pasku Cha Sann.

EAST INDIAN HERITAGE - BOTTLE MASALA

There could be a thousand aromatic and delicious masalas today out there in the market. But East Indians and even some people of other communities in Mumbai swear by the bottle masala.

The bottle masala is very dear and unique to the East Indian community. Although the masala does not include anything fancy or extraordinary, the perfect mix can make almost every curry mouth-watering.

What is Bottle Masala?

Every East Indian household has its own bottle masala stored which is used throughout the year. The bottle masala is a mix of different spices ground together into a powder that can be stored for months.

It is usually made in large quantities and preserved for use for the whole year. There are primarily two reasons for this. One is because it uses around 20+ spices. Secondly, making the masala is a tedious process involving drying the spices in the sun for days, roasting each of the spices, and later pounding them together

Traditionally an 'Ukal' and 'Musal' were used for pounding the spices but nowadays it is ground at the grinding mill.

What makes the East Indian bottle masala so unique is that every family or village has their own distinct recipe for bottle masala in terms of the spices that go in and their quantity. The masala was prepared and stored in glass bottles, hence gaining the name 'Bottle Masala.'

Several East Indians make sure to carry the bottle masala when they travel abroad for its durability and the ability to stay intact for a long time.

AAPLE SANN!

With Easter Sunday being over and Catholics all over the world have entered the Easter season, the feasting and celebrations have begun. East Indians, known for their lively and celebratory culture celebrate two major feasts between April 15, to May 15, 2024.

Sav Jose cha Sann - May 1, 2024

Although the feast of St. Joseph or Sav Jose originally falls on March 19 every year, it is celebrated on May 1. St. Joseph was depicted as a worker in the scriptures and hence his feast is celebrated on May 1, which happens to be Labourers Day. East Indians visit different parishes belonging to Sav Jose in Bombay, where the respective villagers celebrate the feast with great enthusiasm and frolic.

Kondavita cha Sann - May 13, 2024

Although the centuries-old church of St. John the Baptist stands in ruins today, East Indians gather at this secluded church in Kondivita, Andheri East once every year to honor and celebrate the patron. The remains of the church and the surrounding area are decorated and a procession is carried out followed by a feast mass. It is attended by hundreds of people. The mass is then followed by the East Indian band, dancing, and feasting by the community.

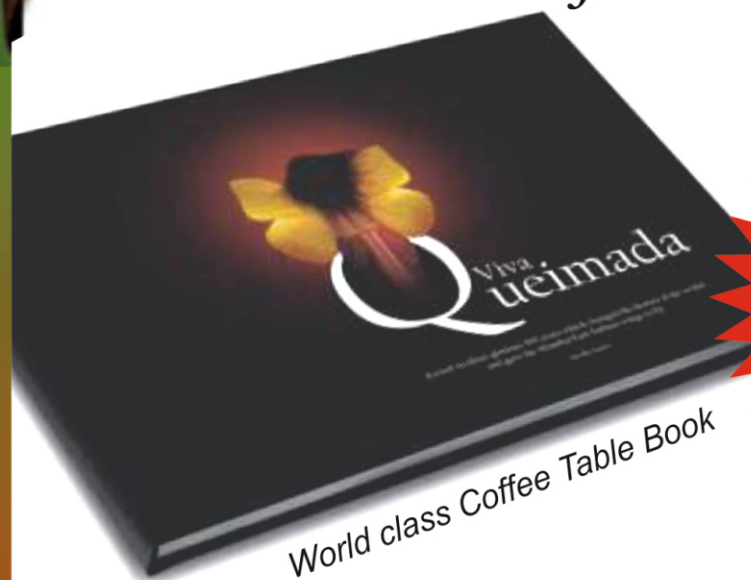
