



EAST INDIAN HERITAGE ITEM - KHIMAD

East Indians love their drinks. In fact, what even is an East Indian gathering without some alcohol and drinks?! Interestingly making alcohol out of fruits for commercial purposes had been a major business for locals back in the day.

And talking of East Indian drinks, Khimad takes the top spot. The ingenious beverage, Khimad, is more than just an alcoholic drink. It has medicinal properties too. And East Indian occasions are believed to be incomplete without serving Khimad.

What is Khimad?

Khimad is an ingenious heritage East Indian drink that is served at most community gatherings. It is traditionally made of country liquor mixed with certain spices.

Khimad also has medicinal properties and is ideal for common and viral colds and coughs. Another interesting fact about Khimad is that, unlike other alcoholic beverages which are usually served cold, Khimad is served hot.

The hot Khimad is served in a kettle. It is consumed as a shot in small glasses called chavnis. Khimad is served at all community celebrations and before having the drink people prefer saying Sukhala instead of cheers.

East Indians are known to love and enjoy their feasts. The month of June marks two important feasts in the East Indian community. Although the celebrations of these feasts are limited due to monsoons, that does not stop the community from celebrating them.

San Jao Cha Sann

San Jao cha Sann or the feast of John the Baptist falls on 24th June 2024.

Succur Maulicha Sann

The feast of Our Lady of Perpetual Succour is celebrated on 27th June every year. Devotees flock to the St. Micheal Church, Mahim every year in large numbers for the feast as well as the nine days novena preceding the feast day.

Many houses in our villages have a Holy cross installed in their compounds and at every prominent landmark. Some are built by local groups while some by families hence the surnames associated with them earlier known as Goths. With Gaothans getting developed with newer constructions the holy cross is slowly getting hidden and at times even shifted to make way for infrastructure projects. As Gaothans are synonymous with a holy cross, all round efforts are needed to create awareness about these religious installations.

Inique place to pray and meditate is in front of the Gaothan Holy Cross. As people pass by irrespective of their religion we witness many paying their respects for the holy cross. The inclusions of statues of saints and mother Mary makes these places even more sacred and respected by the people of other religions. The Holy crosses were visited by papiya singers during lenten time at every Gaothan. Even when the villagers prayed for Rains to St. Anthony they prayed at the Gaothan holy cross. The East Indian brass bands also pay their respects at the cross as a pre-wedding tradition.

estoration of the Holy Cross is the keyword often forgotten in this modern world. The Holy Cross has great relevance to Gaothan Heritage and History. A big worry today is the renovation of our crosses being given a new modernised look instead of restoring the holy cross. It's time the cross owners preserve and protect the original wood or stone structure. In today's times Heritage looks more better and presentable. While restoration may sound challenging it's the need of the hour as each holy cross connects to our communities rich history.

Inity in the Gaothans begin from the Holy Cross. The month of October is a witness to many holy crosses, wherein people come together to recite the rosary. The month of May has all the Holy crosses all decked up with flowers and decorations. The seniors seem all excited and the children look forward to this great month of celebration and prayer. Families offer their rosary referred as Ladin by the community after which channas (chikpeas/grams) and soft drinks are served. One special day is celebrated as the Cross Feast with special refreshments and even dinner for all those who attend. All families around the holy cross come together in prayer this symbolising the Unity in the Gaothans.

Zestful feelings and memories come to life at the foot of the cross as it heals all our worries and blessed us with enthusiasm and success. It's time we place these feelings and memories with a futuristic approach to protect and preserve these historical sites of our existence and identity. 'KURUZ' MGP's Holy Cross Project aims to do the best it can to document the crosses by a basic online survey. We then plan to appoint village cross Coordinators to fulfil our objective to preserve and protect holy crosses. Restoration will also be promoted and financial support given through crowd funding if the locals need support. The Gaothan Holy Cross remains our greatest hope and with great faith let's pray that though this initiative we take our community, its history and heritage to greater heights.
