





Holy Crosses are a common feature at every East Indian Village in Bombay, Thane, Vasai and Raigad. Cross Feast is a prevalent custom anticipated with much zeal in most of our villages. In the month of May villagers gather every evening to recite the Holy Rosary in front of the Community Cross. On the last day of May many celebrate the Cross Feast and are treated with snacks and soft drinks and spend some time mingling together and interacting with each other. As children it was one event in the month of May we did not want to miss. Keeping this in mind Mobai Gaothan Panchayat(MGP) had declared May 31st as Holy Cross Day in the year 2013.

The Holy Crosses have existed for centuries and a sizeable number were built to save the village from plague around a century ago. Majority of them are more than a century old and have heritage value. Some of them need urgent preservation especially when many locals have migrated from their villages. Our East Indian Holy Cross Traditions have existed since centuries even before BMC was established.

The objective of the Holy Cross Day is:

- To promote Unity in the Gaothans by coming together to recite the Rosary
- · Celebrate the Cross Feast as One Gaothan Family
- Protecting the East Indian Gaothans which are being targeted by the authorities
- Preservation and Restoration of the Heritage Crosses to maintain the East Indian Gaothan identity.

Taking these important objectives into consideration MGP has organised Mothi Ladin at Holy Crosses across Gaothans tomorrow on 7th June at 8.00 pm.

This Holy Cross Day let us all pray that our Gaothan Holy Crosses are Preserved, Protected and Restored. May the authorities and those with vested interests respect our Indigenous People - East Indian Ancestral Culture and Traditions.

Importance of Preserving Holy Crosses

Mumbai's holy crosses are the cornerstone of life in its gaothans and villages. These revered crosses are a testament to the faith of the East Indian community.

They were erected to celebrate religious jubilees, to honour family members, in thanksgiving, and most famously in gratitude for the protection offered to gaothans after the bubonic plague that ravaged Mumbai in the 19th century.

With the city changing rapidly in terms of infrastructure and demographics, the social fabric of life in Mumbai's indigenous East Indian villages is changing, yet its crosses remain symbols of East Indian identity, history, and faith. However, these changes pose a threat to the existence of these crosses by way of demolition for infrastructure projects like road widening, redevelopment, and vandalism by miscreants. Once a cross is moved, it fades into history and its relation and significance to the area is

If we want our crosses to exist and thrive, it is necessary to carry out restoration efforts along with spiritual efforts. Many crosses need repairs to improve their structural integrity and protect them from the elements. While repairing them is much needed and appreciated, care must be taken to ensure that they are restored to retain their heritage beauty and historic markers.

Once crosses are rebuilt and their appearance is changed, they lose their credibility in an environment that is hostile to their existence. They need to look their age in terms of aesthetics so that no one dares to question their heritage status. This will help in quashing efforts and silencing voices who wish to remove our holy crosses for whatever reason. This will be quite an effort as it requires expert advice and consultation and increases costs. So it rests upon the community to chip in and help out as a whole.

It has been observed through the ongoing cross census that a large number of Mumbai's holy crosses do not carry any information about patronage or age. Every cross must be accompanied by a plague with details about when it was built and rebuilt along with information on who erected it. In this way, we honour the lives of our ancestors and their faith. If there are miracles or information associated with the cross, it must be recorded with a signboard.

Our crosses have stood for centuries so may we save and cherish them for the centuries and generations to come.



200 YEARS OF BANDRA'S MIRACLE CROSS



The Miracle Cross Was Built On a flat rock Called "PATLA" In Marathi meaning Big Flat Rock by The East Indian Koli Community in the Year 1825. Every Year In the month of May the Local residents used to go venerate and pray at this Cross along the Bandra Sea.

In the nights when the moon light used to shine on the Cross, it used to act like "A Light House" for the fisherman to come back home safely. In the year 1960 when the sea was reclaimed with mud stones and big boulders the young fisherman put a boundary around the Cross with their fishing boats and fishing nets with wooden poles.

In the year 1995 the Municipal Corporator built a brick wall around the Cross. In the year 1989 the Miracle Cross Prathnalaya was built with the MLA funds by MHADA. Every Thursday evening Novena prayers are said at 6pm and On 3rd May every year a Grand Feast is celebrated at this Miracle Cross Prathnalaya. In fact this year on 3rd May 2025 we will Be Commemorating and Celebrating 200 years of this Miracle Cross. Many Miracles like Devotees have been cured of Cancer, Heart ailment, kidney stone and many other serious diseases. People from all other Caste and Religions come to pray at this Miracle Cross Prathnalaya.

*The name Phool Dongri comes from the variety of flowers that grew on the slopes of the hillock where the cross stood first

*This cross has been in existence prior to the year 1882

*This Cross was venerated and honoured by people of various castes and creeds

*During plague epidemic the villagers left their homes and lived at the foot of Phool Dongri Hill and prayed at this Holy Cross on the top of the hill *Every year during the month of May people went up the hill to recite the Rosary

*There was also a practice that newly wed couples went up the Cross to seek blessings for their married life

*The Phool Dongri Sann was originally celebrated with great gaiety and the festival Celebrations went on till evening

*People came for the feast on Reklas and Gaaras

*On September 19, 1936 a Way of the Cross was introduced from Church to Phool Dongri

*In 1958, the Government proposed to build a runaway for the Airport and so asked to shift the Cross.

*The Cross was ceremoniously brought down and re-erected in the Church compound.

rosses are unique to every Gaothan and in fact a Gaothan is complete only if it has a Holy Cross within its borders. As the demography of many Gaothans changes, it also brings in the challenge of protection of our Holy Crosses. The historical and religious relevance at times seems to be lost or forgotten. With the migration of some families outside city limits or abroad, there is no caretaker for some Holy Crosses at times. This can be risky as it may lead to desecration or even demolition. These Holy Crosses should be protected and their distinct identity should be preserved or restored to create awareness of their existence and relevance.

estoration of our Holy Crosses is one of the most important aspects to preserve and promote our Gaothan Heritage. It's saddening to see some of the crosses being renovated and repaired instead of being restored. All Holy Cross owners and care takers should make sure that Crosses are restored to justify its history and heritage. Also, the original structure of the Holy Cross should not be affected due to sheds, grills or walls. Expert architects and restorers can be invited to suggest and advise on what's best for Holy Crosses depending on the material used.

nity begins at the Holy Cross, especially in the months of May and October. This is one of the best sights to see as local villagers come together to recite the rosary. Traditionally in the month of May, Cross Feasts are celebrated in our Gaothans, on a historically relevant day. Rosary is recited throughout the month of May; offered by a family which sponsors grams and cold drinks after prayers. The hymns are mostly in the East Indian dialect honouring Mother Mary and the Holy Cross. The Unity of the Holy Cross should be practiced all year long and not just for a month.


Protection and Preservation is the need of the hour. Restoration of heritage crosses involves high costs towards professional advice and restoration by experts. The State Government should recognise the relevance of Holy Crosses in the city especially because they protected the city from plague more than a century ago. A special State Government policy to protect and preserve the Holy Crosses needs to be implemented. The policy should also sanction CCTV for protection from desecration by miscreants. The Holy Crosses historically protected Mumbai City and it's time the administration realises the importance of these heritage religious structures.

pecial Census to document Holy Crosses will surely help in the future. Each of the crosses should be assigned codes for easy identification and reference. Holy Cross Coordinators should be appointed at a regional and local level to ensure the Holy Crosses are protected and preserved. MGP has launched a mega census in which we plan to register 100+ crosses and initiate a phase wise plan going forward. A ten point agenda has been finalized and soon a Special Holy Cross Policy will be drafted under MGP's Kuruz Holy Cross Project. MGP's team will take expert advice in the creation of the first ever Holy Cross Policy for Mumbai Metropolitan Region.

wareness of the Holy Cross and its rich history needs to be initiated urgently. Social Media will play an important role and the Kuruz project team will initiate multiple strategies to make citizens aware of the existence and identity of Holy Crosses. A History Board or Plaque near each cross could be a good addition besides regular cleaning and maintenance by the Cross Managers. A special fund for maintenance and restoration needs to be started to ensure support to all crosses in need of urgent preservation. Together, let's pray that the Holy Cross may bless our East Indian Community and protect our Gaothans. MGPs Kuruz Holy Cross Project is one of the most challenging ones and we look forward to your prayers and support.


