#### **EAST INDIAN HERITAGE - FUGIYAS**

If we were asked a quick question about one East Indian delicacy, the first thing to probably pop into our minds is "Fugias." We East Indians can never get enough or be bored of fugiyas.

Be it a cup of hot tea, or a spicy, tangy curry preparation, fugiyas can go along well with both equally well.

#### What is Fugivas?

Fugiya is a fried balloon bread made of all-purpose flour. It has a plain yet slightly sweet taste that goes well with curries as well as beverages like tea or coffee. It is also enjoyed as it is. Fugiyas are a must at all East Indian community celebrations as well as private feasts at home.

The delicacy is unique to the East Indian community and is enjoyed wholeheartedly by people of the community as well as other communities. At weddings, it is usually prepared with another kind of donut-shaped bread, known as Waryas.

#### **Fugiyas preparation**

A runny batter made of maida, eggs, yeast, and sugar according to taste, is fermented overnight. This is done to ensure that the batter is well-risen to give it a balloon-like shape and a fluffy texture.

Small round balls of the batter are then deep-fried in hot oil until they are golden brown. Once fried they are best served hot.



#### **EAST INDIAN CALENDAR 2024**

As East Indians observe the korezma, they also prepare for the lenten events and feasts that follow. The month of March mostly has lenten events, which are not celebrated with feasts but are religiously observed by East Indians.

The month of March also marks the Kaka Baptista Day.

#### 17th March - Kaka Baptista Day

Joseph Baptista, also known as Kaka Baptista was a freedom fighter who was a close associate of Lokmanya Tilak during India's freedom struggle. Also regarded as the "Father of the Home Rule Movement," Kaka Baptista is remembered by East Indians every year on his birth anniversary which falls on the 17th of March.

#### 24th March - Ramacha Pass

Palm Sunday, or what East Indians call 'Ramacha Pass' marks the beginning of the Holy Week. It begins with Ramacha Pass and ends with Pascocha Sann or Easter. The name derives its roots from the words 'Ramo' in Portuguese meaning a branch and 'Passo' meaning step. On this day branches of palms fare blessed and distributed in the church. It is followed by a 'Paas' or Passo service including the Veronica singing and the depiction of Jesus and Mary's final meet.

#### 31st March - Pascocha Sann

Easter Sunday, what East Indians call Pascocha Sann, falls on 31st March 2024 this year. It is a day of celebration and feasting among the people of the community. East Indians celebrate Pascocha Sann by attending the Easter night vigil on Easter Eve. Members of the family then pray the house blessing together at 12 noon on the day of Easter. This is followed by scrumptious meals and delicacies.

#### Cursacha Vaat - Way of the cross

Cursacha Vaat has a mix of Portuguese and Marathi language. In Portuguese Cross is known as Cruz and in Marathi Way is known as Vaat. The Cursacha Vaat is conducted at Church or in the Gaothans. The Holy Crosses at junctions and entrances were installed to protect the East Indian villages centuries ago. These Holy Crosses are visited during Korezma for the Cursacha Vaat. Gaothans residents assemble in large numbers and participate in this prayerful journey.

Papiyas - Special Prayers and Hymns at Lenten time Papiya is a Marathi word which means Penitents. Papiyas or Devaats as they are called, are a group of devout christians who move about from cross to cross at the dead of night, chanting prayers and imploring Christians to wake up from their sleep, get down on their knees and pray and ask for God's forgiveness. (Bhavando, utha tumche neezemanche, deemi ghala, lazaar kara, ek Amche Bapala......) These groups become active from the Sunday night before Palm Sunday and their activity culminates in a crescendo on Maundy Thursday (The night of Jesus' Agony on the Mount of Olives). Papiyas organize themselves into groups of 10 to 20 persons, sometimes more. They shroud themselves in black or blue or brown tunics with a hood so they cannot be easily recognized. Their lamentable chants in tones similar to Gregorian chants are in East Indian dialect. Listening to their mournful chants can be a hair raising experience and can send shivers down ones spines, especially when one hears them at the dead of night.

Tradition has it that Papiyas from one village would visit the neighbouring village and vice versa. No two groups could come face with each other. If both groups had the occasion to travel and would cross paths, then the group that spotted the passing group would hide behind the bunds (baands) of the field till the other group passed by. People of the neighbourhood would keep a kettle of hot tea at the foot of the cross for the Papiyas. Papiyas are representative of the apostles Peter, James and John who accompanied Jesus to the Garden of Gethsemane where Jesus prayed and during the 'Agony' on the Mount of Olives.

#### Krist Puran - Special Hymns for Good Friday

The Good Friday Service Preparation and Veneration is managed by the East Indian Community Member Church Groups called Irmous(In Portuguese for Brothers and Sisters of Christ), Konfrat(In Portuguese for Confraternity) or Sodality. During the Service and veneration the East Indian Community members sing the Krist Puran (means sacred writings of ancient times) is a centuries old document on the Passion of Christ.

# Chilly Fry Of Sukhi Kardi (Dry Prawns) And

#### Ingredients

- \* 1/2 cup prawns to be soaked in warm water2 big onions sliced
- \* 2 potatoes cut lengthwise thick pieces
- \* 1 capsicum sliced
- \* 3 green chillies cut into 2
- \* 4 flakes of garlic whole

- \* 3 small brinjals into 4 pieces


